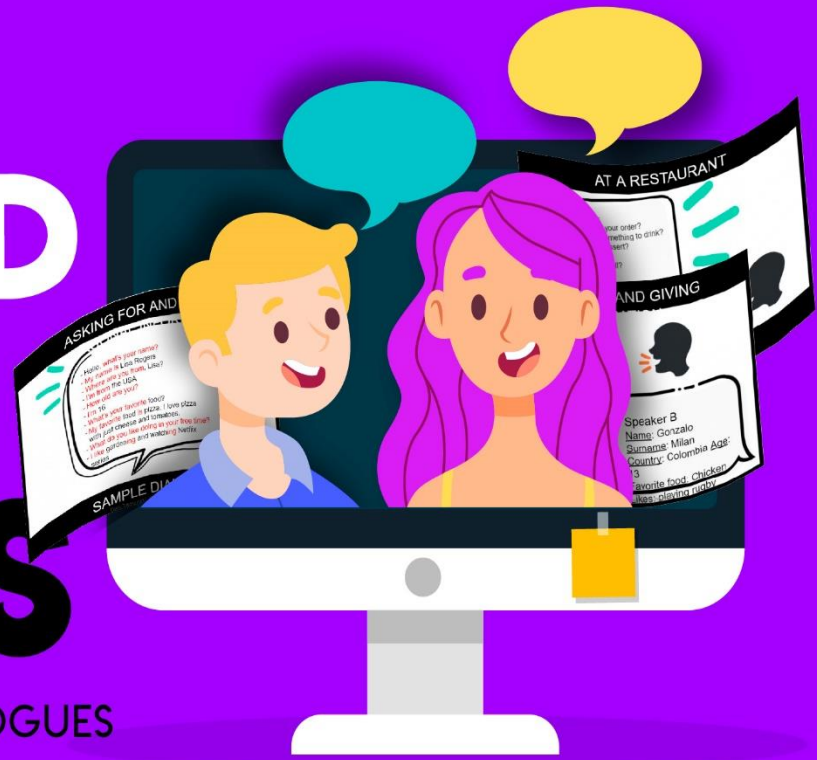

Sheet that will provide students with the language needed for each situation.

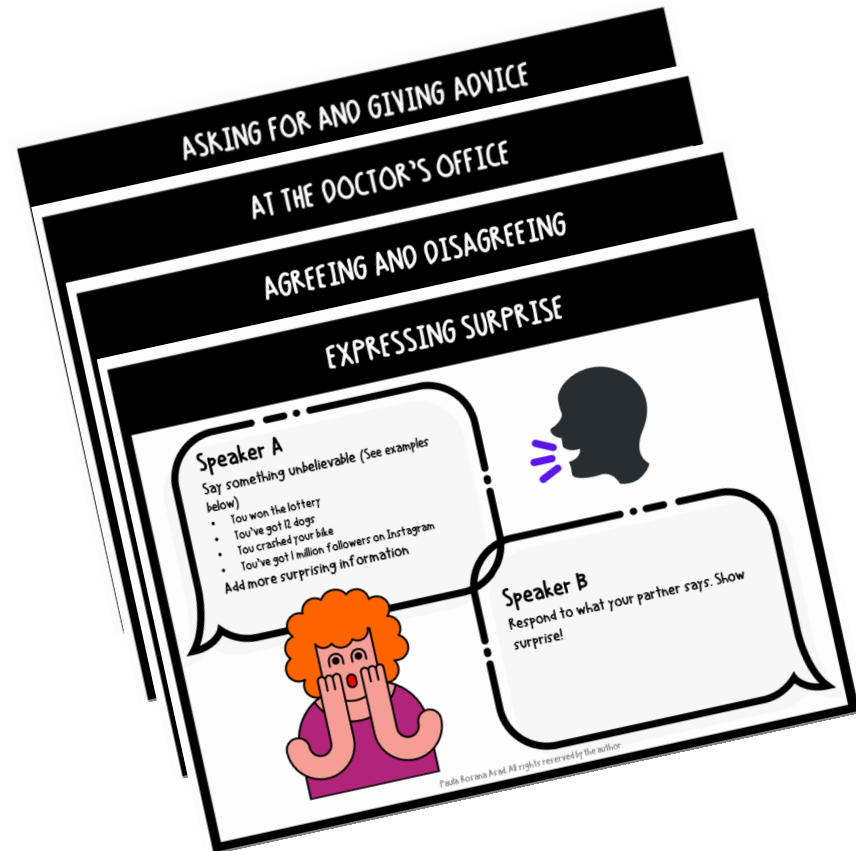
Role Plays are an amazing teacher tool as learners act out real world scenarios and practice speaking with a purpose in mind!

HOW TO USE THIS RESOURCE


- Show students the Sample dialogue. Read it with them a couple of times. Tell your learners to pay close attention to the words and structures highlighted in red.
- Show the task card. Speaker A is the one that starts the conversation. It is advisable that students change roles to practise speaking from different perspectives.
- Go to the language Sheet to revise structures and consolidate vocabulary.

The Teacher's Role

The teacher during a Role Play is a guide, facilitator. Don't interrupt your students while they are speaking, leave grammar correction to the end. Take down notes to give them feedback once they finish the conversation.

Teach your learners some important words like: agree, disagree, apologize, suggest, ask and answer. They are going to be useful to understand what they have to do.



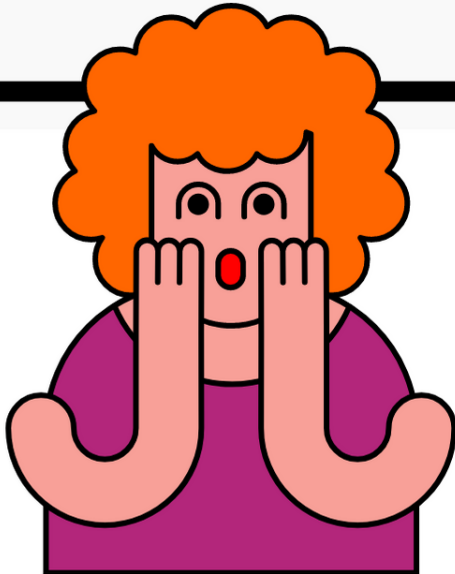
EXPRESSING SURPRISE
