



<u>Through the Magic Mirror</u> <u>Book Companion</u>

Through the Magic mirror book companion is an engaging way to teach students new words, and practice retelling. WARM UP ACTIVITIES

These are some activities you can do with your students to introduce the story. Choose the one that is the most suitable for your learners.

1. Look at the cover of the book. Don't show the title of the story. Ask your students what they think the story is about.



What can you see in the picture? What does the boy look like? What is he wearing? Do you have a mirror at home? What do you think you could do with a magic mirror?

- 2. Play Crazy Pictionary with these sentences.
- a) An orange sun
- b) A fish in the window
- c) A tree on a building
- d) A rainbow in the street
- e) A black umbrella
- f) An invisible man
- g) A ship at a train station

Vocabulary Activities

Try these games to introduce/revise the vocabulary from the story. Building schema will help students in understanding the story.

Bean Bag Toss: Students toss a bean bag onto a card and identify the flashcard it lands on. If they say the card correctly they keep the card but if it is incorrect the card remains on the floor. When all the cards have gone, students count their cards. The one that has the most is the winner.

<u>Draw and Roll</u>. Divide the class into 2 teams. The teacher says "Draw a _____" and students should draw that vocabulary word. If the drawing is correct then the student rolls a dice for points.

Line True or False. Put a line of tape on the floor and designate one side "True" and the other "False". Hold up a flashcard and say its word. If students think that you have said the correct word they jump on to the True side, if not they jump on to the False side. Students who say incorrect answers sit out until the next game.

<u>Slam</u>. Sit the students in a circle and place some objects or flashcards in the middle of the circle. Tell students to put their hands on their heads. The teacher shouts out the word of one of the objects and they race to touch it. The student who touches it first gets a point.



























WHILE READING ACTIVITIES

Vocabulary

As you read, explain difficult words as they come up.

Interaction with students

Stop briefly to ask questions about some of the illustrations. What do you see in this picture? What is the mother doing? What is the father doing? What is wrong with the mirror? What unusual things can you see in the street? Can you describe the lion? What is happening on page ..?

What happens next?

Ask students to guess what will happen in the story. What will (the character) do next?

Critical Thinking

Is it fun to use your imagination when you are bored? Why? Why not? What do you do when you are bored?

What would you see if you had a magic mirror?

AFTER READING ACTIVITIES

<u>Put the sentences in order</u> See page 14

One-Pagers

A One-Pager is a creative response to a learning experience and allows students to make connections between words and images. One- Pagers help learners to think creatively and critically about the information they've learned. Children share their one-pagers and have a group discussion evaluating the experience. See pages 14-19.




One Pagers Directions


This is what your ONE PAGER must include:


- 1. Two borders with the words you learned in the story.

- 4. An image with the characters or your favorite character in the story.
- 5. An image or words that represent the setting of the story.
- 6. Words or images that represent the beginning of the story.
- Words or images that represent the middle of the story.
- 8. Words or images that represent the end of the story.

Add other symbols, drawings, or words that represent the reading for you!




